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

"Do you want to play it?" I couldn't believe that Jon Foreman, Switchfoot's frontman, was handing me the 1959 Gibson 125 he'd just purchased at the Dallas Guitar Show. *Gulp.* "Umm ... yeah," I croaked.

That moreover speaks volumes about Jan-and the multiplatiours band he leads. But after speaking 90 minutes talking with him (as well as his brother and bess player, Tim Foremen, and drummer Ched Butler), I con't say I was tatally surprised at his easygoing generasity.

Yeu never know assatly what to expect when you meet celebrities. And despite their humble attitudes, the guys from Switchfoot definitely qualify for their title. Their 2003 allows The Boostiful Lotdown seld 2.5 millien copies and spawned two Top 20 singles. "Meent to Live" and "Dare You to Move," songs you could have missed only if you were living under a tock that your. Since then, the San Diego quintet bis fellowed up with the more allowers, 2005's Nothing Is Sound and 2006's OM Gravity.

As it turns out, these guys wear the mantle of success well. If you didn't know any better, you'd think they were simply some of the coolest surfer dudes you've ever met (which is also true). Parhaps that's because the members of Switchlost have a deeply grounded—and deeply biblicelunderstanding of what true success nearly is

Thed the privilege of backging aut with the backd in Arlengton, Taxes, ingle before the fact show on the Ohl Grandy tour in late April. Not only did I got to strum Jon's visitage Gibson and then catch a terrific concert, but I got a brief portrait of the band's hutery and its somewhat complicated relationship to the Ohristian music scene. I also learned how these artists' faith shapes not andy their music, but also their convictions about what matters music in life.

#### IS SWITCHFOOT A "CHRISTIAN" BAND?

I remember exactly where I was the first time I heard a Switchloot song. I was driving under an Interstate overpass in Colorade Springs when I heard "Dare You to Move." I wasn't paying much attention when these words jumped out at ms. "Maybe redemption has stories to tell/ Maybe forgineness is right where you tell." Did he put say sconothing about redestption and forgineness? I wendered. So I tened in and turned up the radie. "Where can you run to escape from yourselff/Where you genne ge7/Selvetion is here." Way, I remember thinking, that's gotto be u Christian band.

I was right-sort of.

Growing up in San Diago, the members of Switchfoot had little exposure to Christian radio. Se when they agred with Charlie Peacock's Christian lobal, rethink, in the mid-'90s, they did so, according to Jon, without much linowledge about the world of contemporary Christian music.

"We were certainly all ballevers," he explains, "but being from Sen Diego, you have no idea of the behemoth that is the industry of Christian culture. You're just thinking, Wow, here are snow beforevers who make our sic too, just like us. And you dive in, and suddenly you realize that there's this whole Christian industry. When we deve in with Charlie, it was with a very noive understanding of everything."

As a rosult, Tim says, the guys didn't think that they should be making music only for other Christians-but that they could definitely influence the culture with a message shaped by their faith. "As far as Christian radio goes, we didn't know the thing axisted," Tan says. "We're all pastors' kids, but we gree up in an environment where there wasn't this hand line between sacred and secular. But there was this idea that if the God we serve is greet and wenderful, why weuden't there be things of beouty and truth-His lingerprints-all over the culture, not just in the guy who's making music for the church."

Given that background, Jen says that he's somewhat leavy of the "Christian band" label but eager to claim ellegiance to Christ

"The conversation about "What is a Christian band?" could go in so many different ways, "Sen says. "But at the same time, as believers, we've obways been henced to be affiliated with the name of Christ. That's something that for me is a true hence and not something to be taken lightly."

#### CONFRONTING THE AMERICAN DREAM

One biblical truth the band's songs often illustrate is how the stuff of this earth won't ultimately satisfy us. Perhaps the song that best sums up that message is "Meant to Live," where Join sings, "We want more than this world's got to effer/ ... And everything inside screams for second life."

Throughout the band's career, Switchfoot has slammed the idea that we can so easily place our faith in material things rather than in God. Two songs into Ohl Growity, for exemple, 1 found myself wincing as I listened to "American Dream": "I want to live and die far begger things/Tm tired of Righting for just me." Ooch, I thought. That readly rasks it I do want to live for more than just myself. S6B, even though I know botter, sematimes I'm tempted to believe that what matters most in life is getting the read thing I want.

Tim says of this track's meaning, "I think ear society teaches us that burning out bright is going out with a lot of toys or a lot of recognition, at the peak of stardom, whatever that looks like. I think in the kingdom of heaven, it looks completely the opposite. The person who couldn't core loss about what he's wearing but who's deveted to serving the people around him-that's a star."

"When I first beend that song." Chad adda, "I thought of this experience I had when I was a kid. I went to London to see Mother Terese and Frontis Schoolfer speak. I remamber my parents talling me about Mather Teresa and the work she was doing [serving the poor in India]. Then I remember years later when she died, feeling like that's the model, that's the ber that's been set of someone who was living for others to the very and of her life."




